

A

AB A musical form where you perform the verse, then the chorus.

ABA A musical form where you perform the verse, then the chorus, then the verse again

ABACA A musical form (also called Rondo form) where you perform the verse, then the chorus, then the verse, then the bridge, then the verse again

Accelerando Gradually faster

Accent Mark A symbol (>) above or below a note or chord showing it should be performed with more strength than usual

Accidentals Sharps, flats, or naturals used in a song that are not part of the original key signature

Accompaniment Music that supports or complements a solo instrument, voice, or group

Adagio Slow

Aerophone An instrument with a vibrating column of air

Allegro Quick

Alto The second highest singing voice

Amplitude The loudness of a sound, represented by the height of a sound waveform

Andante Moderately slow

Animation A way of making a movie by using a series of drawings, computer graphics, or photographs of objects (such as puppets or models) to create the appearance of movement when viewed quickly one after another

Arco Play with the bow

Aria A song sung by a soloist in an opera

Arpeggio Pitches of a chord played one after another

Articulation Different ways notes can be sung or played

B

Bachi Drum sticks

Bar lines Vertical lines on the staff that mark off measures

Baroque Period A period of history from 1600-1750 that emphasized fancy music, art, fashion, and architecture

Bass The lowest singing voice

Bass Clef A musical sign for the lower staff of piano music and low instruments and voices

Beat The heartbeat of music

Beatboxing A form of vocal percussion involving the art of producing drum beats, rhythm, and musical sound using one's mouth, lips, tongue, and voice

Blocking The process of planning where, when, and how actors will move about the stage during a performance

Blues A style of music that typically has 12 measures, three chords, a slow tempo, and sad lyrics

Bordun A repeated accompaniment, typically in the bass, usually performed as double stops containing the melodic homotone and 5th

Busking English term for a street performer who performs in public for tips.

C

Cafe Performer A performer who plays music for tips while people eat

Call and Response A soloist sings different verses alternating with a group who sings a phrase that does not change

Canon A melody imitated exactly by two or more voices/parts, each entering at different places

Celebration Song A song celebrating holidays, seasons, or other special occasions

Chord Three or more different notes performed at the same time

Chord Chart A diagram that shows only lyrics and chord symbols

Chord Progression Moving from one chord to another in a song

Chordophone An instrument with a vibrating string

Choreography The sequence of steps and movements in a staged production

Chorus The B section in a piece of music

Circle Show A performer who gathers a crowd around him/her. The performance has a distinct beginning, middle, and end

Classical Period A period of music from 1750-1820 that emphasized balance, order, and simplicity

Clave The backbone rhythm pattern of Latin American music

Color and effect Musical elements that make a song more interesting

Composer A person who writes original music

Composition An original piece of music

Compound Meter The result of multiplying any simple meter by three (Example: $2/4 \times \text{three} = 6/4$ OR $4/4 \times \text{three} = 12/4$)

Concert band A group of woodwind, brass, and percussion players who perform in a concert hall

Concerto A composition for solo instrument accompanied by an orchestra

Conductor The leader who directs a musical group

Crescendo Gradually get louder

Cumulative song A song where each verse builds on the one that came before

Cut Time In a measure of 4, the beat is represented by a half note

Daiko A type of drum, group, or style of playing

Decrescendo Gradually get softer

Descant A melody part that's higher than the main melody, added for color and effect

Diaphragm A muscle that extends across the bottom of your rib cage and helps you breathe

Diatonic The notes of a major or minor scale or key

Dissonance A lack of harmony among musical notes

Duration The length of a sound

Dynamics How loud or soft music sounds

E

Embouchure The way you form your lips in or on a mouthpiece to play a wind instrument

Evaluate Judge the quality of a song or piece

F

Fermata A symbol that tells you to hold a note or rest beyond its usual value

Fill A small improvised musical break that adds interest in a song

Flat A musical symbol placed before a note to lower the pitch by one half-step

Foley The art of creating sound effects using combinations of objects

Form Organizing music into sections

Forte Loud

Freestyle Creating improvised lyrics over a backing track or beat

Frequency How often a sound wave is repeated in a second, higher pitches have more cycles, lower pitches have fewer cycles

Fretted instrument An instrument, such as the guitar, with strings stretched over raised metal strips (frets) on the fingerboard

Fugue A polyphonic composition in which a short melody (the subject) is introduced by one part, successively imitated by others, and developed by interweaving the parts

Genre A specific category of music

Grave Very slow (solemn)

H

Harmony Two or more different notes performed at the same time

Head The melody and chord structure of a piece of music used in Jazz

Home Tone The most important pitch in a song, often "do"

Hook A catchy melodic fragment used throughout a song

I

Idiophone Any object that creates a sound when you strike, scrape, shake, or rattle it

Impressionist Period A period of music (1870-1910) that emphasized music as impressions, atmospheres, and dream-like sounds.

Improvisation The art of spontaneously creating music while singing or playing, rather than performing a composition exactly as written

Improvising Spontaneously creating music on the spot

Interval The distance in pitch between two tones

Introduction Opening section (usually instrumental) designed to prepare the listener for the composition to follow

Inventions Collection of 30 short, yet masterful keyboard pieces by J.S. Bach that exemplify a special type of imitative counterpoint

J

Jamming A musical event, where a group of musicians play (i.e., "jam") by improvising without preparation or predefined arrangements

Jingle A catchy or memorable tune or song that advertises a product

K

Kabuki A type of dance-drama theater in Japan dating from the medieval period, known for the elaborate make-up and costumes worn by performers

Key (1) The tonal center of a composition and all of its related notes, typically based on a major or minor scale. (2) On keyboard instruments, the levers (keys) depressed by the fingers. (3) On woodwind instruments, metal levers covering finger holes which cannot be directly covered by the fingers

Key Signature Sharps or flats at the beginning of a song that tell you what notes to perform

Lamellophone An instrument with a vibrating tongue

Larghetto Rather slow

Laghissimo Extremely slow

Largo A very slow, broad tempo

Leap A big skip (an interval greater than a major 5th) Note: This term avoided in our curriculum

Legato Performing notes in a smooth and connected manner

Leitmotif (Also see motif) A short theme or musical idea intended to represent a character, place, object, or situation

Librettist The writer of the text of an opera

Libretto The text of an opera

Lyrics The words of a musical composition

M

Major Key A key whose melody and harmony are based on the major scale

Major Scale A scale consisting of seven different notes forming five whole tones (w) and two half tones (h) in the arrangement w-w-h-w-w-w-h

Mallet A stick, usually with a round rubber head, used for hitting percussion instruments

Mambo Played by the horn section and designed to inspire the dancers to greater intensity

Measure Used to organize beats into groups, usually of 2, 3, or 4 beats

Media The main means of mass communication (especially television, radio, newspapers, and the Internet) regarded collectively

Medieval Period A period of history from 800-1450 characterized mainly by music of the church and traveling poet-musicians

Medley A musical composition made from a number of songs

Melodic Direction The shape or outline of the melody notes

Melodic Ostinato A short, repeated melodic pattern used to support a song

Melody Pitches that follow one another in a song

Membranophone An instrument that vibrates a membrane or skin

Meter The organization of beats into measures of 2, 3, or 4 beats

Meter sign A musical symbol that tells you how many beats are in a measure and which beat equals one count

Metronome A device that helps musicians keep a steady tempo when they practice

Microphone A device that converts sound waves into electrical energy

Minor Key A key whose melody and harmony are based on the minor scale

Moderato Medium tempo (Moderate tempo)

Modern Period Period from about 1910-present, characterized by rapid changes in musical forms and styles due to dramatic innovations in recording and broadcast technology, amplification, electronics, computerization, and more

Molto Very

Montuno A special chorus that includes call and response

Motif A short theme or musical idea intended to represent a character, place, object, or situation

Motif / Motive A short melodic figure or fragment of a musical theme (e.g. first 4 notes of Beethoven's 5th symphony)
(Also see Leitmotif)

Mridangam An ancient drum of India shaped like a long conical barrel with two tuned heads of different sizes

Musical Alphabet The recurring musical tones A to G

N

Natural A musical symbol placed before a note to cancel a sharp or a flat and return the pitch to normal

News Producer The person responsible for gathering all of the pieces of a newscast (stories, packages, video, graphics, etc.) and putting them together into a sensible show

Note A written symbol that represents a given pitch

O

Octave The same note, an interval of eight pitches higher or lower

Onomatopoeia The naming of a thing or action by a vocal imitation of the sound associated with it

Opera Singers performing a dramatic work combining libretto and musical score in theatrical setting, accompanied by orchestra or smaller instrumental ensemble

Origami The Japanese art of folding paper into decorative shapes and figures

Ostinato A short repeated musical pattern, rhythmic and/or melodic, used to support and/or complement a musical piece

Overture An orchestral piece of music at the beginning of an opera

P

Partner song Two different songs, sung at the same time, that fit together

Patch The settings on a synthesizer to create a specific sound

Patriotic Music Music you sing or play because you're proud of your country

Pentatonic A scale that contains do, re, mi, so, and la

Percussion Instruments that are hit, shaken, or scraped

Phrase a musical sentence

Piano Soft

Pianoforte Keyboard instrument invented in 1698 by Cristofori whose strings are struck by hammers, capable of playing soft or loud

Pit Orchestra An orchestra that accompanies performers in operas and musicals

Pitch How high or low a note sounds

Pizzicato Plucking with fingertips

Plot The main storyline

Polyrhythms Different rhythms performed at the same time

Pop Music Music that is popular today

Post Production Adding graphics, music, and any other effects after the visual part of a film has been created

Prestissimo Very Fast

Presto Fast

Program Notes A written commentary in a concert or opera program intended to inform the listener about the music to be performed

Progression Moving from one note to another or one chord to another in a song

Q

Question & Answer The question starts the phrase (rhythm or melody) and the answer completes the phrase

R

Range The lowest to highest pitch that can be sung or played

Recitative A passage in opera in which the words are sung in a way that resembles speech

Refrain After a verse, a repeated section - also called the chorus

Reggae A popular form of music that originated in Jamaica during the 1960's

Renaissance Period A period of "rebirth" from 1450-1600 where new experimentation in music, art, and literature took place

Repeat To perform a given section of music again, as indicated by the sign(s)

Repeat Sign A symbol placed at the end of a section of music that tells us to repeat that section

Repeated Notes Notes of the same pitch performed one after the other

Reprise A musical repetition

Responsible Journalism Reporting stories based on multiple sources and facts in order to inform and educate a specific audience

Reverberation The echo of a sound that continues after the initial sound

Rhythm A pattern of sound connected to the main beat

Ritardando Gradually slower

Romantic Period A period from 1820-1910 that emphasized passion, drama, and emotion in music

Rondo form Musical form ABACA popularized during the Baroque period

Round A song where each voice enters at a different time singing the same melody

S

Scale A succession of notes, usually either a whole or half tone apart, arranged in ascending or descending order

Setting The place where the action happens

Sharp A musical symbol placed before a note to raise the pitch by one half-step

Sixteenth Note A note lasting one-fourth of a beat

Skip Any interval from a line note to another line note, a space note to another space note, or greater (A minor 3rd or greater)

Solo One person singing or playing an instrument

Song A musical story or poem that people sing

Soprano The highest singing voice

Sound Vibrations perceived by our ears

Sound Wave An invisible wave that carries sound to your ear

Staccato Performing notes in a short and detached manner

Staff Five lines and four spaces for writing music

Stage Presence The ability to command the attention of a theater audience by the impressiveness of one's manner or appearance

Standard Commonly agreed upon pieces of music played by jazz musicians

Steady Beat A regular beat that does not change; a regularly occurring pulse (heartbeat)

Step An interval from a line note to a space note or a space note to a line note (A major or minor 2nd)

Strong Beat The first beat of a measure

Subcontinent A large landmass smaller than a continent or major subdivision of a continent

Swing A natural rhythmical groove in jazz

Syncopation Placement of rhythms or accents where they wouldn't normally occur, such as on the weak beats or off-beats

T

Taiko Fat drum

Tala A regular, repeating rhythmic phrase, usually played on a percussion instrument

Tempo The speed of the beat in music

Tenor The second lowest singing voice

Tenuto To hold a note for its full value

Theme A complete, self-contained melody (as in "theme and variations")

Theme The subject of a story

Tie Curved line connecting two successive notes of the same pitch, indicating that the second note is not played, but its value is added to the first

Timbre The character or quality of a musical sound apart from its pitch and volume

Timecode A coded signal on videotape or film giving information about things such as time elapsed and frame number

Toccata A composition for keyboard (usually pipe organ) designed to show off the instrument's capabilities as well as the talents of the composer and performer

Tone Color Fine distinctions in tone quality between two or more matching instruments or voices

Transcribing Listening to a piece of music and writing it down

Treble clef A symbol that tells us to sing or play higher notes

Tremolo The rapid repetition of a note or chord by back and forth strokes

Troubadour A writer and performer of songs in the Middle Ages

U

Underscore Music The music that accompanies a film, TV show, or animation, and helps bring the action on the screen to life

Unison Different instruments or voices performing the exact same melody at the same time

Uta Song or Poem

V

Variation A modification of a melodic theme

Verse The A section in a piece of music.

Vibration A series of small back and forth movements

Vibrations Oscillating air columns set into motion by any instrument or voice

Vibrato While pressing a string on the fingerboard, the finger moves rapidly side-to-side to create a varying pitch

Vivace Very quick or lively

W

Walk-by Acts A busker performs while people walk by on the sidewalk

Waveform A visual representation of a wave


Weak Beats Any beat that comes after the strong beat

Whole Note A note lasting four beats

Whole Rest A rest lasting four beats

Whole Step An interval equalling two half steps

Whole Tone Scale A scale consisting of whole tones only, thus having six notes to the octave




