

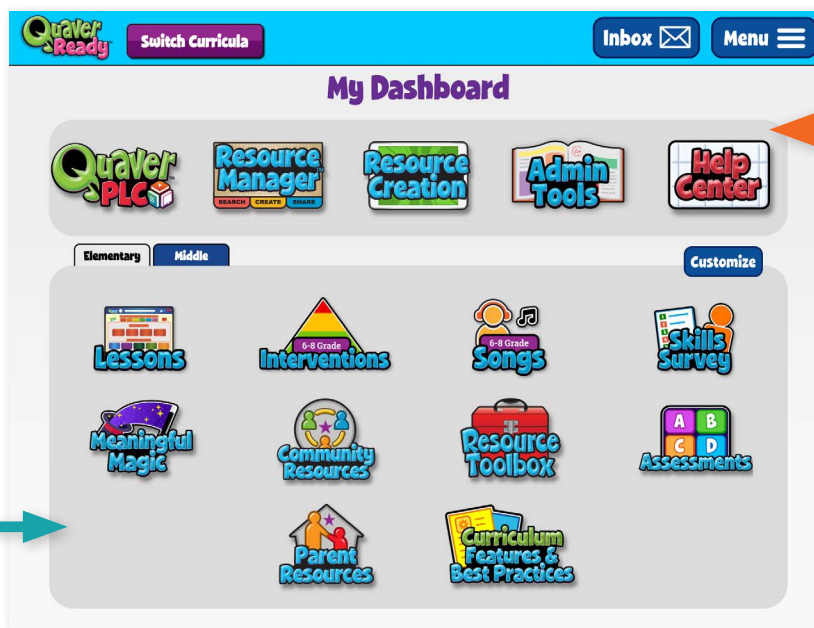


Quick Start Guide

Dashboard Icons

The QuaverReady Dashboard houses all curriculum, intervention, assessment, and instructional tools. Icons can be customized to match your instructional priorities. Below are brief descriptions of commonly used Dashboard icons. *Availability and use may vary by grade level.*

Take a break! Provides a calendar of daily 5–10 minute activities to promote mindfulness.



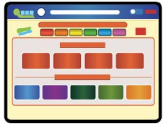

Lessons

QuaverReady Lessons support students' personal, social, and academic growth through engaging activities, songs, videos, stories, and real-world applications.

Grades Pre-K–5

Lessons are organized by **competency** and can be implemented flexibly through:

- 30–45-minute weekly lessons, or
- 5–10-minute daily lessons using a **Morning Meeting** approach

Grades 6–8

Lessons are organized into **units** designed for deeper exploration, collaboration, and real-world application, with flexible pacing to fit middle school schedules.

Interventions

QuaverReady Intervention Resources provide **Tier 2 and Tier 3 support** for individuals and small groups.

Elementary Interventions

Interventions include Individual and Small Group lessons, behavior supports, and Peace Corner resources for self-regulation and de-escalation.

Middle School Interventions

Interventions include Individual, Small Group, and Brief Interventions designed for flexible use in counseling or pull-out settings.

Interventions may be implemented over several weeks or in shorter cycles, depending on student needs.

What's in a Lesson?

Welcome

Introduce the topic, objectives, and vocabulary.



Topic Discussion



Initiate discussion and assess prior knowledge.

Lesson Mindset

Learn and reflect on a key phrase for student retention.



Song or Story



Engage students in the topic.

Application and Critical Thinking Activities

Students apply their learning and connect to their lived experiences.



Reflection and Assessment



Allow students to reflect on and share their learning.

Welcome

Set norms and begin building relationships.



Define

Name and define the area of need.



Identify

Notice the area of need and its impacts.



Apply

Learn and consider new strategies.



Practice

Practice skills and strategies learned.



Reflect

Reflect on progress and prepare to move forward.
